We Now Have A Home!!

Following some strategic planning and a period of negotiations in 2018, The Huntley Historical Society (THHS) and the Huntley Park District (HPD) entered into an agreement that proves beneficial to both organizations. THHS leases the farmhouse on the Deicke Stowell property from the HPD. Both groups will consider the appropriate use of this historic location, and the Society now has a headquarters. Such partnering should allow for a greater opportunity for success as we move forward. Having a home gives THHS stability that allows for possible grant acquisition. The HPD benefits by housing a historic group thereby helping to fulfill their mission to keep this farm's past alive. It's a win-win!

Next Steps

As with most growth, we must begin with baby steps. At this point, THHS Board members are the only Society members allowed in the farmhouse. Once washrooms meet ADA compliance, some wiring is redone, etc, the public will be welcomed inside the farmhouse. Consultations to plan this work have begun. We're ready to move forward!
